KILVE TRANSPORT STRATEGY

We have received the first report from Somerset Council Highways on our Kilve Village Transport Infrastructure Strategy presented in February 2022. It is a good start.

The key changes agreed so far are 40mph from Holford to Kilve and Quiet Lanes designation for Sea Lane and Pardlestone Lane. These will be 30mph along their length.

The Traffic Committee has sent a response restating the need for Quiet Lanes in Hilltop Lane and Rowditch Lane. We have also requested that the A39 30mph speed limit be moved towards Holford so that it includes the new exit from the Hilltop Jubilee Path. The Highways report does not mention the new pedestrian crossing in the centre of the village so we have reiterated the need for this on safety grounds.

Maps showing the proposed changes are on the Kilve website and will be available at Coffee Morning. There are nine maps in total; the master, with the snappy title **70096034-100-00**, plots the remaining sheets covering each of the areas of the road network.

Since the Homes for Ukraine scheme was launched in March 2022, Somerset has welcomed over 1,500 Ukrainians to date, with host families playing a pivotal role in creating a safe environment for guests to re-settle and rebuild their lives in some way, supporting and helping them navigate a new life in the UK.

Becoming a host (or sponsor) can be hugely rewarding, with the key consideration being the ability to provide a bedroom and a comfortable place to live for a minimum of 6 months.

Somerset Council can provide more information about how hosts and guests are matched, training and support for both parties, checks and visits that form part of the arrangements, thank you payments to hosts and what to do if the relationship breaks down.

Have you joined the Village Hall 100 Club?
