READING GROUP

The Group met in September after a summer break and had been reading *From Crime to Crime* by Sir Richard Henriques. This was a departure from



our usual genre, being a non-fiction account of various high profile Court cases with which he was involved. After taking silk in 1986 he appeared in no fewer than 106 murder trials and was appointed High Court Judge in 2000. He also sat in the Court of Appeal, hearing some very famous appeals.

The entire book was a fascinating insight into the workings of the judiciary and contained more information than was reported in the press at the time of the events. Some of the facts were extremely harrowing, particularly in the Jamie Bulger case and the Morecambe Bay cockle pickers, but he gave balanced opinions on the outcomes of all the cases. The Harold Shipman case commanded the largest section of the book and was also very informative. The review of Operation Midland was an interesting chapter too. All in all, it was a very worthwhile read.

It was a beautifully written account and surprisingly an easy read considering the content. It turned out to be a really good choice for the group with so many points raised, and the style of writing meant that it could be read alongside other lighter reads. Sir Richard has now retired. Using his experiences, he has made some suggestions for reforming the criminal justice system. One can only hope he will have some influence.

KILVE QUIET LANES PROJECT

As reported in last month's *Kilve News*, we have sent our response to Somerset Highways' initial thoughts on the project. There were positives in relation to the A39 speed limit reduction to 40mph, and to quiet lanes status being supported for Pardlestone Lane and Sea Lane. We have reiterated the need for Hilltop and Rowditch to be added and speed limits in quiet lanes to be 20 mph. We have also requested information about the proposed pedestrian crossing near the shop which they did not mention.

The observant will have noticed the Kilton junction chevrons and cast iron finger post were destroyed in a collision recently. This has been reported and followed up with Highways. Kilve Parish Council Traffic Committee continues to push for progress in these matters.

POST OFFICE NEWS

Most of you are probably aware that we have had problems with our Post Office recently, I will explain why.

During the dreaded network change programme around 15 years ago, when the Post Office tried to close as many small counters as possible in order to save money, Kilve was downgraded from a Sub Post Office to a partner Post Office.

To be honest, it was only my persistent begging and pleading and being generally very irritating to the Post Office management that persuaded them to give me a chance to increase trade and business and keep the Post Office in Kilve (and probably just to shut me up!).

As a partner PO we are contracted to a larger PO and they supply us with all our stock, cash etc; we get paid £50 per week to have the PO in the shop and the rest of the pay is based on transactions, so the busier we are the more money we make.

We fully appreciate how important the PO is to so many locals and passers-by, especially with all the banks closing.

Our recent problems are due to the operators of our partner PO, Alcombe Post Office, who decided to close very quickly without warning. Unfortunately they didn't call me and let me know and they also owe us a lot of money.

Not only has Alcombe now lost its Post Office, a business that had been trading for nearly a hundred years, but Watchet PO has also had to close, and Kilve Post Office was on the brink of possible closure two weeks ago.

However, I'm pleased to say we have now reached an agreement to be partnered with Washford Post Office. The Postmaster there seems to be a very nice professional chap who is highly regarded amongst Post Office regional management.

By the time you read this Kilve PO should be fully restocked and trading as normal.

Although this was a happy outcome, it just goes to show how fragile small businesses can be, especially village shops and Post Offices. Here one minute and gone the next.

Maybe this should serve as another wake-up call, and we remind everyone once again...





TWENTY-FIVE YEARS AGO

From Issue 114, October 1998

A pine table was advertised for sale, and mature loganberry plants were offered free (both only in *Kilve News*). The table was sold within a day and loganberry plants went to at least four local homes.

NOT WELCOME HERE!

Sometimes you will, if you are lucky enough (depending on your point of view!), see European hornets in gardens in Kilve and in the countryside round about. It is our largest wasp species and quite a magnificent beast. I was in my apiary the other day and heard a low hum. I saw a European hornet fly sedately past the entrance of one of my hives, turn round, fly back, and catch a returning honeybee in its mouth in mid-air! It was a spectacular piece of predatory flying really, though I was sorry for the poor honeybee. The hornet may have taken the bee back to its nest to feed to its young or it may have eaten the meal itself. Such losses are an inevitable part of the cycle of nature and pose no great threat to honeybee colonies.

However, there are growing signs that the Asian hornet could be spreading to UK shores from parts of continental Europe, where it has become established. There have been more confirmed sightings this year than in the last six combined. This non-native species poses a serious risk to honeybees and other insect species. It has a particular liking for honeybee colonies and has caused very serious losses in western France and northwest Spain in recent years. It is also established on Jersey.

A single Asian hornet hovering in the air outside a hive can catch, kill and eat up to 30-50 honeybees per day. This method of killing the bees is called 'hawking' and our native honeybees have evolved no defence against such a threat. If there are Asian hornets hawking by a hive, the honeybee colony can swiftly collapse because the foraging bees are picked off and cannot collect the nectar and pollen the colony needs.

Asian hornets are slightly smaller than our native European hornets. Distinguishing features of the Asian hornet include yellow legs, an orange face and dark brown/black body with a broad orange band at the rear of the abdomen. have seen something that resembles an Asian hornet, you can report it via the phone app Asian Hornet Watch – (https://risc.brc.ac.uk/alert.php?species=asian_hornet).

A photo would be great, but **take care not to approach or disturb a nest**. Asian hornets are not generally aggressive towards people, but an exception to this is when they perceive a threat to their nest, at which point they can become highly aggressive. This is like any stinging insect, including wasps and honeybees.

The National Bee Unit (NBU) works with the British

Beekeepers' Association (BBKA) and more than 1000 specially trained beekeepers across the country to locate and destroy Asian hornet nests. It's quite an operation.

I recently set up a baited trap in my apiary as a monitoring station. The bait is something they apparently find irresistible, though to the editor it smells like nail varnish — and it's bright pink!.

This is the time of year to keep an eye out for Asian hornets. Please can you help by keeping your eyes peeled when out in your garden or in the countryside. If you think you
