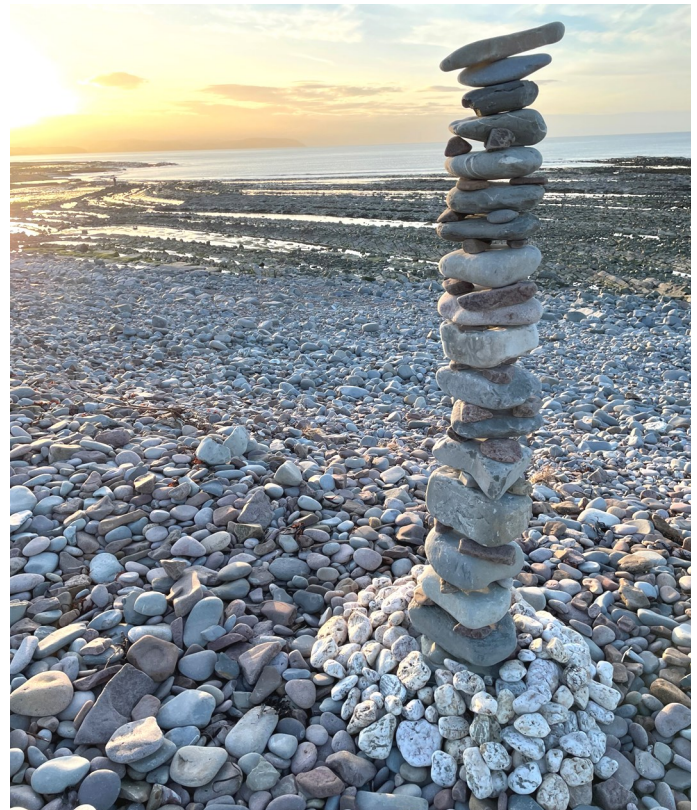

MESSAGE IN A BOTTLE

Last month's issue mentioned the value of having information available that would be useful to emergency services in the event of an accident or sudden illness.

The Lions Club, a charitable organisation, has produced a pack to do precisely this. Known as *Message in a Bottle*, it consists of a form to be filled in with relevant personal, medical, and contact details, together with a bottle to keep it in, in the fridge. A sticker is provided to go on the outside of the fridge, thus notifying any emergency personnel that the information is there.

Thanks to Pat Woolley's contacts, the village now has a supply of these useful packs, which are available at the monthly KVH coffee mornings. So if you haven't already got a pack, why not collect one now?

READING GROUP

This month's book was *Shuggie Bain*, the 2020 Booker Prize winning novel by Douglas Stuart.



It tells the story of young Hugh Bain, known as Shuggie, and his alcoholic mother Agnes. The book takes place in some of the poorest areas of Glasgow in the 1980/1990s and is set against a background of pit closures, unemployment and poverty where domestic strife, alcohol and drug abuse are commonplace.

Life isn't easy for Shuggie growing up, trying to keep up with school while he cares for his mother during her drunken episodes and taking on many responsibilities at home.

The book provides a social documentary of difficult times but is also the story of the love and devotion of a boy for his complex and damaged mother.

The Group felt it was a compelling and very well written book but a bit too depressing for some. The harsh reality of the story didn't make for a comfortable or easy read and it came over as a grim, realistic reflection of society.

Booker Prize winning novels have made for interesting discussions in the past and this one was no exception.

STRANGE SPRING BLOSSOM

It was a lovely early spring day. There was a bright light in the sky, which we haven't seen very much at all of late. My wife and I decided to walk down Sea Lane to the beach with our dog. The hedges are really coming into bud now, but about 400m down the lane, my eye was caught by a black dog poo bag (with contents) hanging in the hedge, then another and another and another....

Mixed emotions followed, including anger and dismay. By the time the walk was over, we had noticed a lot of such bags on both sides of the lane, mostly within a stretch of 150m. I had been thinking the dog poo problem in Sea Lane had got better. But only because it was finding its way into a bag and then into the hedge, it seems!

After ruminating unhelpfully about this incomprehensible sight for a while, my logical brain kicked in and I resolved to do something about it. The following morning, we returned with a litter picker and sack and removed what we could – about 30 bags! A couple of bags sadly eluded my reach. Those we collected will now be handled and managed, as all our waste needs to be, by the local authority. Dog poo should be bagged and binned, either in the street bins, or at home. It is the most considerate way, with the local community and our lovely environment in mind.

The birds will be nesting in those hedges soon. Make the most of the weather and our beautiful countryside this spring, if you can.

VILLAGE AGENT UPDATE

Supporting Somerset's communities with the impact of Fuel Poverty has been a top priority for The Community Council for Somerset (CCS) this winter. Our Village and Community Agents hosted 25 energy saving focused events across the County as part of National Energy Saving Week in January. They were joined by over 300 people and gave away 200 goody bags full of energy-saving, warmth-giving items donated by our partners. Several 'cooking on a budget' demonstrations were held and offered plenty of hints and tips with ingredients to take home, and many took part in free quizzes and raffles to win slow cookers, hot water bottles, warm bags and thermal cooking bags.

Our Knit for Your Neighbour campaign has been hugely successful with well over 250 hand-knitted, crocheted, sewn and donated blankets donated, 184 of which were distributed to the most vulnerable during our events. Thank you to everyone who continues to put so much time and creativity into producing these blankets for our campaign.

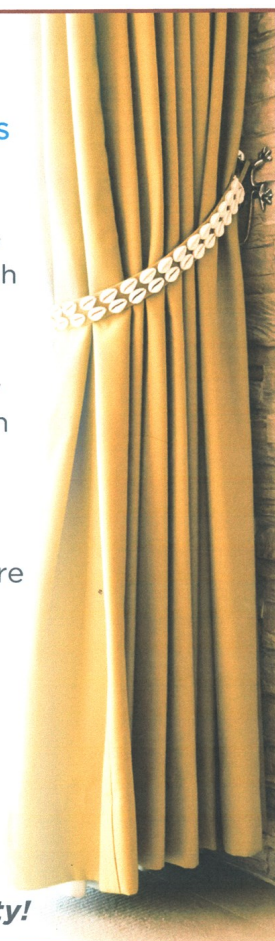
